On Friday June 25, 2004, representatives of Nextel Communications, Inc. ("Nextel") and Southern Communications Services, Inc. d/b/a Southern LINC ("Southern") met jointly and separately with staff of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau ("Bureau") regarding the Commission's above-referenced proceeding on public safety communications in the 800 MHz band. Attending on behalf of Nextel were Robert Foosaner, Lawrence Krevor, and Geoff Stearn. Attending on behalf of Southern were Robert G. Dawson, Michael D. Rosenthal, Holly Henderson, John D. Logan, Alan McIntyre and Christine M. Gill, Counsel for Southern. Attending on behalf of the Bureau were John B. Muleta, Catherine W. Seidel, David Furth, Aaron Goldberger, D'Wana Terry and Michael Wilhelm.

The parties discussed the possible spectral alignment of Southern and Nextel in certain markets in the Southeastern United States were the Commission to realign the 800 MHz band, as reflected in the parties respective *ex parte* filings on this matter, (See e.g., Nextel's June 14, 2004 *ex parte* letter and Southern's June 24, 2004 *ex parte* filing).
