
Dear Ms. Dortch:

On July 16, 2004, David Donovan, President of the Association for Maximum Service Television, Inc. (MSTV), and Jack Goodman, Senior Vice President and General Counsel of National Association of Broadcasters (NAB), and the undersigned, counsel for MSTV, met with Commissioner Adelstein and his Legal Advisor, Johanna Shelton, to discuss the DTV biennial review proceeding and the FCC's proposal in that proceeding with respect to a "use-it-or-lose-it" maximization and replication deadline. MSTV and NAB raised concerns with respect to the impact the proposed policy would have on the DTV transition, ultimate DTV service, and smaller broadcasters and raised points included in their written comments to this proceeding.
