On August 26, 2004, Mike de la Chapelle and Carlos Nalda of The Boeing Company ("Boeing") and Russell Fox and the undersigned of Mintz, Levin, Cohn, Ferris, Glovsky and Popeo, P.C. met with Richard Arsenault, Jay Jackson, and Roger Noel of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau and Julius Knapp and James Schlichting of the Office of Engineering and Technology to discuss the above-captioned docket.


The parties discussed the following three different alternative licensing models for the Air-to-Ground ("ATG") band: (1) two exclusive licenses (one for 2.5 MHz the other for 1.5 MHz); (2) two overlapping 2.5 MHz licenses; and (3) four overlapping 2.5 MHz licenses. The Commission staff sought additional information from Boeing how these different approaches would affect the data rate that customers would experience, the technical rules that each approach would require, and the feasibility of sharing in the ATG band. The Boeing participants discussed Boeing's ATG proposal as reflected in the attached slides, which were provided to the Commission staff at the meeting.
