Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Tuesday, September 28, 2004, Lawrence Krevor, Len Cascioli, Michael Ha, and I spoke with Roger Noel, Richard Arsenault, B.C. "Jay" Jackson, Jr., Thomas Derenge, Gregory Vadas, and Lynne Milne of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau and Ira Keltz and Ron Chase of the Office of Engineering and Technology. We discussed the probability that reconfiguring the air-to-ground band would cause harmful interference to cellular, special mobile radio, and public-safety licensees in adjacent bands. No party has meaningfully addressed these inter-band interference issues in this docket. The Commission should develop a comprehensive record on inter-band interference prior to adopting a service-rules order in this docket. A copy of our presentation is attached.

The Commission has sought comment on these issues in WT Docket No. 00-258. Under section 1.1206(b)(2) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206(b)(2), please associate this letter with WT Docket No. 03-103.
