
Relative to WT Docket 02-55, the APCO representatives urged the Commission to proceed expeditiously to finalize any outstanding issues.

Relative to CC Docket 94-102, the APCO representatives discussed APCO's recently filed "Request for Declaratory Ruling." They expressed particular concern that the NRIC process was unlikely to reach a resolution of key issues related to E911 accuracy measurement, and that the overall NRIC process placed public safety participants at a disadvantage due to their severely limited time and resources.

Relative 04-36, the APCO representatives urged the Commission to proceed as quickly as possible to address the critical 9-1-1 issues associated with rapidly expanding VoIP services.
